OUR PURPOSE

The Matthew Pavelka Scholarship Fund was established in honor of Burbank Police Officer Matthew Pavelka, who tragically lost his life in the line of duty on November 15, 2003.

The purpose of the Matthew Pavelka Scholarship is:

- To provide an award for high school seniors who have demonstrated outstanding effort to pursue a vocational goal.
- To motivate students to dedicate themselves more thoroughly and responsibly to their education or training.
- To encourage students to strive for excellence and distinction in whatever they undertake.

RULES OF ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must have applied, or about to apply for admission to a recognized junior college, accredited college or university, public or private, offering academic, or vocational courses leading to a secondary education.
- Applicant must also be a graduating high-school senior from: Burbank High School, John Burroughs High School, Monterey High School, Providence High School, or the dependent of a Burbank Police Officers' Association current active or retired member.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Five Scholarships up to \$4,000 available.

Application deadline: February 27, 2026

HOW TO APPLY

THE MATTHEW PAVELKA FUND

The Burbank Police Foundation Matthew Pavelka Fund was established after Officer Matthew Pavelka tragically lost his life in the line of duty on November 15, 2003, and Officer Greg Campbell was gravely wounded. In that one instance of brutal gun violence, an entire community was devastated.

Less than 24 hours after the incident, our community's unbelievable generosity began to pour in. The businesses and residents of Burbank and the surrounding communities' kindness and support was overwhelming. The Burbank Police Foundation established a fund for the donations. There was never a question as to the career path that Officer Matthew Pavelka would follow. After high school he joined the Air Force - only because he was too young to enroll in a police academy.

He served for five years as a military policeman, received an associate of arts degree in criminal justice, and intended on further pursuing his education in his chosen field.

The guidelines of the Scholarship Awards Program:

Applicants must be a graduating high school senior from Burbank High School, John Burroughs High School, Monterey High School, Providence High School, Burbank Police Officers' Association current active or retired member's dependent.

Applicants must have applied, or about to apply for admission to a recognized junior college, accredited college or university, whether public or private, offering academic, or vocational courses leading to a secondary education.

Applicants must provide a completed application form.

One current wallet size school photo I.D.

A complete copy of the applicant's high school transcript.

Two letters of recommendation. One letter must be from a current 12th grade teacher or counselor. One letter may be written by any adult, who is not a relative.

Applicants must submit completed applications and all requested materials to the Burbank Police Foundation by February 27, 2026. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered. Scholarship Award recipients will be notified by March 13, 2026.

- Applicants must submit completed applications and all requested material to the Burbank Police Foundation by February 27, 2026. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.

Timeline Packets provided to all schools by Friday, January 30, 2026. This is a firm date for delivery.

February 27, 2026

Applicants must submit completed applications and all requested material to the Burbank Police Foundation. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.

March 2, 2026

MP Committee receives applications for review.

March 11, 2026

MP Committees top three name shall be selected.

March 13, 2026

Applicants selected shall be notified via email of assigned interview appointment.

March 18, 2026

Scheduled appointment must be confirmed by recipients.

The following dates are subject to change

March 25 & March 26, 2026

Interviews will be scheduled from 3:30 p.m. – 5:30 p.m., for the top three applicants selected from each school and BPOA.

March 31, 2026

Announcement of Scholarship Award recipients selected.

May 5, 2026

Presentation of Scholarship Awards at the Burbank City Council Meeting at City Hall.
